I received a call from an American who owns 5 **radio stations** here in Ghana. He was speaking with the owner of two stations here in Takoradi. I spoke with the owner and he would like to lease one of the FM licenses. I do not know what to expect from this phone conversation or even if it is a viable opportunity. We have prayed for years and tried to acquire a license for the radio station, but it has never become a reality. By the time you receive this report, we will have even more information concerning this as a possibility. We need prayer. This type of ministry would give us a wonderful opportunity to send the gospel to at least two larger towns (app 2 million people) and out into the jungle where literally thousands of villages would be able to hear "the old, old story." I believe this is God's will. I do not know how He will make it happen, but it is our desire so that every little boy and girl along with their families may hear of the peace and joy that my Father can give. I cannot do this financially. Our support has dropped considerably during the past year and the costs here have increased seriously. I do know that if it is God's will he will open the door and supply the needs. Please let me know how you feel about these burdens. I respect your opinions.



The mission in **Kasoa** is growing but not so quickly. The search for some type of more permanent meeting place is proceeding. The need for different housing for the Orus family has become more and more evident as the landlord randomly refuses to allow them access to water and electricity. This is caused by the housing demand,



desire of the landlord to expel the tenants and increase the rent for the new tenants. They expect people to move out when they cut off the utilities as there is no chance of refund. There is nothing we can do. His rent will expire in September and there is need for the family to find another place to live. We have located an uncompleted place that would be very good but it will cost 3,600 Ghana Cedes for the next two years. The owner is asking two years and will not consider anything less. He will rent it to someone because the place is larger and reasonably priced for the area. The cost is 150 Ghana Cedes per month (app \$ 107.15) He will use the funds to finish the house and then the family will be able to occupy the place. The local church here has enough saved to pay for one year.
